- **Annual Novena** in honour of Our Lady of Sorrows: Monday, September 7-15.

OUR LADY OF SORROWS-“Softener of Hearts”

In the Western Rite of the Orthodox Church, there are two Feast Days dedicated to the mystery of Our Lady's Sorrows. The First is on the Friday before Palm Sunday and the second comes on the day after the Triumph of the Holy Cross (Sept. 14). Both Feast Days commemorate the role of our Blessed Lady in the Life of Her Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ and ass all feasts of the Mother of God, point towards Him.

On February 2, the same day as the Great Feast of the Meeting of the Lord, Orthodox Christians commemorate a wonder-working icon of the Theotokos (Mother of God) known as "the Softening of Evil Hearts" or "Simeon's Prophecy."

It depicts the Virgin Mary at the moment that Simeon the Righteous says, "*Yea, a sword shall pierce through thy own soul also....*" (Luke 2:35) She stands with her hands upraised in prayer, and seven swords pierce her heart, indicative of the seven sorrows. This is one of the few Orthodox icons of the Theotokos which do not depict the infant Jesus. The refrain "*Rejoice, much-sorrowing Mother of God, turn our sorrows into joy and soften the hearts of evil men!*" is also used.

In this Parish, for some time we have celebrated both of these Feasts with the *Via Matris*, the Way of the Sorrowful Mother of God and meditate upon her seven Sorrows. In the Fall, a Novena (a period of nine days of prayer) is held in which we offer our petitions to the Virgin Mother of God. It is hoped that all of our people will participate in this powerful prayer.

Wisdom from the Church Fathers: This is our festival, that we celebrate God coming to mankind that mankind might go back to God our Father. Off with the old human nature, on with the new! Once dead in Adam, now alive in Christ! Born with Christ, crucified with Christ, buried with Christ, risen with Christ! *St. Gregory the Theologian* (+390AD)
