

THE THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT GAUDETE SUNDAY DECEMBER 13, 2015

AUDETE means "rejoice." Anticipated joy over our Saviour's coming coming breaks through all our serious Advent preparations. Although it Although it cannot be entirely repressed, our joy is yet restrained for two for two reasons: 1. Like John the Baptist, even the most fervent person feels a great unworthiness either to be a friend of Christ or to be His apostle. 2. Very often our joy is dulled by unnecessary anxiety—an over-extension of self because of the demands of the secular world in this season of faith. We let our peace of soul depend too much upon persons and events and circumstances, and too little upon God's infallible and tender care.

WINTER EMBER DAYS

Next week, during the week following the Third Sunday in Advent, the Winter Ember Days occur. The Ember Days are days of pray, fast and abstinence that mark the four seasons of the

year. It is also an excellent "marker" or reminder of **our need for Sacramental Confession**; reconciliation with God and neighbor. In our Antiochian Archdiocese, it is recommended that one make his Confession **AT LEAST four times per year**. The Ember Days serve as the perfect time to do that in our Western Orthodox Tradition. It is also a good idea to go to Confession before the Great Feast of the Nativity of Our Lord. **Don't wait till the last minute**—come during the Ember Days.
