**T**HE Archangel Gabriel told Mary that her Son was to be called JESUS. Joseph, too, was told by an angel: and at the circumcision ceremony the foster father officially gave the name JESUS to Mary's Son.

The Name means "God saves," and it describes the mission of the divine Child as the Saviour of mankind. The redeeming life of this newly named Babe will be climaxed when He is lifted on Calvary above the host of creation, when He rises from the tomb as the Redeemer of the human race.
