"INTERFACE" a Catholic/Orthodox convergence

As a part of our ongoing ADULT EDUCATION SERIES and outreach program, we will be offering a **conference on Iconography and the Santos tradition**. Father Lester Bundy, Ph.D., pastor of St. Columba Antiochian Orthodox Church in Lafayette and former Chair of the Religious Studies Department of Regis University will be our presenter. He has written a book about things that are different and yet have things in common. It is a book about two religious traditions that come from the same source and have a common history. It is also a book about finding things to share and celebrate rather than finding things to fight over. This book celebrates two artistic traditions rich in symbolic beauty. But this book also raises some concerns about the effect of modern technology on ancient practices and conventions in religious art. The book looks at Russian Icons and New Mexican Santos and finds an interesting convergence of two different rich traditions. The event will take place on Saturday, June 4th at 2:00pm and will last about 2 hours.
