- **THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING** will be celebrated with splendor on **Sunday, October 30.**
- **ALL SAINTS DAY** will be celebrated on **Tuesday, Nov. 1 with Mass at 7pm.**
- **ALL SOULS DAY**, the "Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed", will be observed on **Wednesday, Nov. 2** with Mass at 7:00pm. The OFFERING ENVELOPES for your departed friends and relatives are on the table in the Narthex. Please put THE FIRST NAME ONLY, printed legibly; enclose your offering and put it in the collection. Your departed ones will be remembered at the Mass on All Souls Day and throughout the entire month of November.

WORLD FOOD DAY, October 16<sup>th</sup> is sponsored by the Food and Agriculture Organizations of the United States, and was especially designed to heighten public awareness of food and hunger issues around the world. The Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese of North America is one of the sponsoring organizations for the National Committee for World Food Day. We now join **458** voluntary organizations throughout the United States and **163** countries around the world observing **WORLD FOOD DAY!** Last year **110 of our Parishes** reported participating in this much needed program, with **40 parishes** participating **all year long. We distributed 418,324 pounds of food within our communities.** For 32 years we have pledged our support to our local food banks, and again are asking each Parish to sponsor a CANNED FOOD DRIVE. Please ask your parishioners to bring canned goods to Church between Sunday, October 9th and Sunday, January 1, 2017.

### KING SOOPERS GIFT CARDS

We **fell significantly short** of our goal this past month. Remember what a painless way it is to augment your giving to the Church by the use of your King Soopers Gift Card every time you buy groceries, renew prescriptions, gas-up the car, etc. If you have not used your Card in over 90 days, you need to get a new one so that it can be registered to the Church's Account.
