- **ADVENT** Remember, we practice the ascetic fast and abstinence of anticipation of the Birth of the Lord on all Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays during Advent and Christmas Eve. FASTING is the taking of one whole meal per day and two smaller meals not equaling a full meal and ABSTINENCE is refraining from flesh meat and sauces, soups, gravies, etc. made from meat. If you need to follow a different regime for medical or other reasons, please receive the blessing of your Pastor before embarking on such a thing.
- DECORATING OF THE CHURCH: Sunday, December 18 after Coffee Hour. Many hands make light work!

THE AMBROSIAN CHORISTERS & ORCHESTRA WILL PRESENT FESTAL MUSIC FOR THE EVE OF CHRISTMAS on Saturday, December 24th beginning at 11:30pm. The Pre-Midnight Mass music will consist of Mozart's magnificent motet Exsultate Jubilate, featuring Stephanie Anne Ball, coloratura soprano and orchestra, and Vincent Novello's arrangement of the traditional carol Adeste Fideles in the style of Mozart. At Mass, the "Credo-Mass"—a joyous, festal and sparkling setting of the Liturgy by Mozart will be heard with Pergolesi's Glory to God in the Highest at the Offertory and Mauro-Cattone's touching Christmas Lullaby Ninna Nanna (Sleep, O Child Divine) at Communion.
