DECEMBER 11, 2016

GAUDETE means “rejoice.” Anticipated joy over our Saviour’s coming breaks through all our **serious Advent preparations**. Although it cannot be entirely repressed, our joy is yet restrained for two reasons: 1. Like John the Baptist, even the most fervent person feels a great unworthiness either to be a friend of Christ or to be His apostle. 2. Very often our joy is dulled by unnecessary anxiety—an over-extension of self because of the demands of the secular world in this season of faith. We let our peace of soul depend too much upon persons and events and circumstances, and too little upon God’s infallible and tender care.

*MSGR. MANGELS HAS ANNOUNCED THE CHRISTMAS EVE PROGRAM

THE AMBROSIAN CHORISTERS & ORCHESTRA will present FESTAL MUSIC FOR THE EVE OF CHRISTMAS on Saturday, December 24th beginning at 11:30pm. The Pre-Midnight Mass music will consist of Mozart's magnificent motet **Exsultate Jubilate**, featuring Stephanie Anne Ball, coloratura soprano and orchestra, and Vincent Novello's arrangement of the traditional carol **Adeste Fideles** in the style of Mozart. At Mass, the "**Credo-Mass**"—a joyous, festal and sparkling setting of the

Liturgy by Mozart—will be heard with Pergolesi's **Glory to God in the Highest** at the Offertory and Mauro-Cattone's touching Christmas Lullaby **Ninna Nanna** (Sleep, O Child Divine) at Communion. The Mass will conclude with Handel's **Hallelujah Chorus** from **The Messiah**. The traditional carols of Christmas will be sung by the congregation and choir and the **Gregorian Chant Propers of the Mass** will be sung by the *schola cantorum*.
