*MSGR. MANGELS HAS ANNOUNCED THE CHRISTMAS EVE PROGRAM THE AMBROSIAN CHORISTERS & ORCHESTRA will present FESTAL MUSIC FOR THE EVE OF CHRISTMAS on Saturday, December 24th beginning at 11:30pm. The Pre-Midnight Mass music will consist of Mozart's magnificent motet **Exsultate Jubilate**, featuring Stephanie Anne Ball, coloratura soprano and orchestra, and Vincent Novello's arrangement of the traditional carol **Adeste Fideles** in the style of Mozart. At Mass, the "**Credo-Mass**"—a joyous, festal and sparkling setting of the Liturgy by Mozart—will be heard with Pergolesi's Glory to God in the Highest at the Offertory and Mauro-Cattone's touching Christmas Lullaby Ninna Nanna (Sleep, O Child Divine) at Communion.
