But the Church has always outlived its opponents, blossomed with truth and sacramental life, and borne the fruit of saints, martyrs, and countless sincere Christians. All we have to do is to look at the Church of Russia and the former Soviet bloc to see this at work.

A reminder to dress your best for Divine Liturgy. Why? Because it not only reflects an inner attitude of respect and reverence for God (and yourself) but it also shapes that inner attitude. God will accept us as we are but we must ask ourselves: Would we dress like this if we were going to a wedding or a funeral, to a dinner at a nice restaurant, or a meeting with a special dignitary? When we come to liturgy we are attending the great wedding banquet between Christ the Bridegroom and His bride—the Church (us). At a minimum we should not wear jeans, shorts, or tennis shoes.
