## UPCOMING EVENTS AT SAINT AUGUSTINE'S

Here are some important upcoming events at St. Augustine's Parish. Please mark your calendars. **ADVENT** Remember, we practice the ascetic fast and abstinence of anticipation of the Birth of the Lord on all Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays during Advent and on Christmas Eve. **FASTING** is the taking of one whole meal per day and two smaller meals not equaling a full meal and **ABSTINENCE** is refraining from flesh meat and sauces, soups, gravies, etc. made from meat. If you need to follow a different regime for medical or other reasons, please receive the blessing of your Pastor before embarking on such a thing. Advent is a good time for spiritual self-examination and the Sacrament of Confession.

- **ANNUAL MEETING:** Change of date: **Sunday, January 15.**
- **Christmas Schedule:** Sunday, December 24, Vigil Mass at 10:00am; at 11:30pm the choir and orchestra will present the pre-Mass music and the Mass at Midnight.\* Low Mass on Monday, Christmas Day at 10:00am.
- **Epiphany Concert**—*Resonet in laudibus*, the second annual Epiphany Concert at St. Augustine's, will be offered at **4:00 p.m. on Saturday, January 6, 2018.** Alexandra Eddy will play viola with Mackenzie Talley, soprano, and Richard Robertson, organ. Works to be performed include Alexandra's arrangements of familiar vocal music of the season; two movements of Johann Sebastian Bach's Cello Suite in G major, transcribed for solo viola; two solo organ pieces, and the world premiere of Alexandra's *Es ist ein' Ros' Entsprungen* for unaccompanied viola, based on Johannes Brahms's lovely organ prelude of the same name, Op. 122, No. 8. Admission is free, and all are welcome. There will be an opportunity to make a freewill offering, all proceeds from which will benefit the Music Program at St. Augustine's. Refreshments will follow!

### \*MSGR. MANGELS HAS ANNOUNCED THE CHRISTMAS EVE PROGRAM

THE AMBROSIAN CHORISTERS & ORCHESTRA will present A FESTIVAL OF MUSIC FOR THE EVE OF CHRISTMAS on Sunday, December 24<sup>th</sup> beginning at 11:30pm. The Pre-Midnight Mass music will consist of a selection of Christmas music for voices, organ and violin. During Mass, the *Missa Brevis in G*, KV 140 (*Pastoral Mass*), a joyous, festal and sparkling setting of the Liturgy by Mozart will be heard with Peter Latona's arrangement of *Behold a Mystical Rose* at

the Offertory and John Rutter's *What Sweeter Music* at Communion. The Mass will conclude with Mozart's *Church Sonata in C*, KV 328. The traditional carols of Christmas will be sung by the congregation and choir and the *Gregorian Chant Propers of the Mass* will be sung by the *Schola Cantorum*.

### WHY THE MASS AT MIDNIGHT ON CHRISTMAS?

The Mass of Midnight, with its peculiar timing, carries with it something of the "nightliness" of the feast—where a star appears and a new babe, the Saviour, is born—and is something we should all experience. The so-called "Christmas family Mass" that is often celebrated on Christmas-Eve (in fact, it is the vigil Mass for Christmas, watching and waiting for Christmas to come) has somewhat eclipsed this in a type of accommodation to what it is thought easiest for families with younger children. But every Mass is a celebration of the family of the Church, in which children take their part, and no more so than at Christmas. We do a disservice to children and young people by infantilizing the liturgy. What could be more powerful, even something of a treat for children, for a family to take its place amid the parish family in the church at midnight on this day each year, to "taste" the silence of this night and glimpse for themselves the first light shed by the star over Bethlehem? It is a sacrifice to stay up late, but so was the Incarnation itself!

WE NEED parishioners to function as ushers and greeters for Midnight Mass and ask that as many of you as possible to please take pictures and videos at the Mass for our website.
